### Laura Smith

Community Food Shelf Manager at Aitkin First Lutheran Church

In late Winter of 2022, Lynne Jacobs (Aitkin County CARE Director) and Hannah Colby (SHIP Coordinator) reached out to Laura Smith to assess if she had any interest in transforming the food shelf into a SuperShelf. Laura was more than willing to collaborate and was a champion leading this work!

The transformation (included: electrical work, paint, removal of carpet, new flooring, new cooler, new freezer, and signage which is translated into Ojibwe) was completed in Summer of 2022. Laura knew the SuperShelf framework is to

promote consumption of fruits and vegetables and applied for American Rescue Plan Federal Grant. The Community Food Shelf at Aitkin First Lutheran Church was awarded \$12,442.74 to purchase fresh or frozen fruits and vegetables for the food shelf last year. Laura did not stop there, she also wanted to support our local farmers and learned how to purchase fresh produce from the Aitkin Farmer's Market Hub via their online platform called Open Food Network.

Aitkin First Lutheran Church was officially certified by the University of Minnesota Extension as a SuperShelf on March 9, 2023 (see picture above).

Thank you Laura for your hard work and willingness to help increase accessibility of fresh produce and nutritious food to our community! You rock!

# The Beanery Cafe (The Terrace Project)

Applied to receive a community partner award toward *The Terrace Project* focusing on promoting local food. SHIP grant funding will help purchase an infographic, being created by Background Stories, to feature the local food environment unique to Aitkin.

The Beanery Cafe will be a pickup site for Veggie Sides and Market Share Boxes in the near future to help increase accessibility to local food.

#### Aitkin Farmers' Market Hub

Applied to receive a community partner award to help fund supplies for FVRx program at Riverwood Healthcare Center and expect to onboard a goal of 100 participants the first year. These participants will receive 6 boxes of the Market Share. This means that just through FVRx, the Hub will fill up to 600 boxes with local produce alone.

The Aitkin Farmers' Market Hub can buy food products from local farmers and then sell it to restaurants, schools and other institutional buyers. The Hub runs a successful CSA-type subscription that they call "Market Share" and "Veggie Sides."
